The Leonardo Opens New Downtown Office

Art, Culture and Science Center Also Retains Volunteer Coordinator

SALT LAKE CITY—Aug. 16, 2004—The Library at Leonardo Square (www.theleonardo.org), an art, culture and science center opening in the former main Salt Lake City Library building, announced today that it has secured downtown office space at 243 East 400 South. The office is located directly across the street from Library Square, where The Leonardo will be housed. The office will serve as a central location for fundraising, operations and program development activities.

The Leonardo also announced that it has retained Jessica Breiman to provide contract administrative and volunteer coordination services.

About The Leonardo

Inspired by Leonardo da Vinci—one of history's most versatile visionaries—The Leonardo will be a one-of-a-kind Art, Culture and Science center that encourages visitors to explore subjects from new perspectives.

The Leonardo will open in the former Salt Lake City main library building on Library Square. From this exciting location, The Leonardo and the magnificent new City Library will create a dynamic public square for research and learning. The mission of The Leonardo, with its innovative art-culture-science approach, is to become a national model for exploration, discovery and invention.
